

FIONA RAE (b. 1963 in Hong Kong) studied at Croydon College of Art in London and received her Bachelor of Arts from Goldsmiths College in London. In 1988, Rae, along with many of those who would become the Young British Artists, participated in the seminal show 'Freeze,' in London. Rae exhibited in the Aperto at the 44th Venice Biennale in 1990 and was shortlisted for the Turner Prize in 1991. In 2002, the artist was elected to the Royal Academy of Arts in London, where she was subsequently appointed Professor of Painting from 2011 to 2015.

Over an illustrious career spanning almost four decades, Rae's work has been the subject of solo exhibitions at institutions such as the Carré d'Art, Nîmes, France; Centre d'Art La Malmaison, Cannes, France; Institute of Contemporary Arts, London, United Kingdom; Kunsthalle Basel, Basel, Switzerland and Leeds Art Gallery, Leeds, United Kingdom, amongst others.
